### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Companion welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10:01 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

### ► A. APPROVE THE DECEMBER 6, 2023 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Companion asked that the December Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the December 6, 2023 meeting minutes; Steve Smith seconded; motion unanimously carried.

### ► B. FOOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2023/24 THROUGH FY 2027/28 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Victoria Kutney presented the following amendments to the Transportation Improvement Program for FY 2023/24 through FY 2027/28.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve FDOT's request to amend the FY 2023/24 through FY 2027/28 Transportation Improvement (TIP); Steve Smith seconded; motion unanimously carried.

### ▶C. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2024 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group that 23 CFR 490 requires FDOT to adopt aspirational targets for *number of fatalities, number of serious injuries, fatality rate, serious injury rate, total number of non-motorized fatalities and series injuries.* The North Florida TPO is also required to adopt annual performance targets for these measures and would like to adopt FDOT's safety performance targets.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Bill Killingsworth asked if the results for 2023 are available.

Mr. Letter responded the Annual Mobility Report outlines the measures for our four-county region and is on the TPO's website.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the 2024 Safety Performance Targets as presented; Elizabeth Backe seconded; motion unanimously carried.

# ►D. RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY'S (JTA) 2024 PERFORMANCE TARGETS FOR TRANSIT ASSET MANAGEMENT

Jeremy Norsworthy of JTA informed the group that in accordance with the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act, Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST), and the Transit Asset Management Final Rule, JTA seeks the North Florida TPO's concurrence with the compiled State of Good Repair (SGR) targets.

Mr. Norsworthy asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Doug Conkey moved to approve the endorsement of the Jacksonville Transportation Authority's (JTA) 2024 Performance Targets for Transit Asset Management; Steve Smith seconded; motion unanimously carried.

### E. <u>DRAFT 2024 LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP)</u>

Clark Letter presented the draft 2024 List of Priority Projects (LOPP).

This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the Florida Department of Transportation's Five-Year Work Program. Our expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

• Jeff Sheffield informed the group the list has been capped at 20 projects for over a decade. The key is to be on the list, not where you are on the list.

We are also planning to kick-off a review of our processes, with two or three board members to sit on the committee.

Michael Grunewald asked if there is a threshold on this list.

Mr. Sheffield responded there is no threshold.

### F. <u>DRAFT REQUESTED STUDIES FOR FY 2024/25 – FY 2025/26 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)</u>

Clark Letter presented the draft requested studies for the FY 2024/25 – FY 2025/26 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP).

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

Kelsey Cox asked what are the limits of the Merrill Road project.

Mr. Letter deferred to Laurie Santana of the City of Jacksonville's Planning Department.

Ms. Santana responded she will email that information to Ms. Cox.

### G. LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN (LRTP) UPDATE

Wiley Page of Atkins gave a brief update on the LRTP.

Mr. Page asked for questions.

 Marci Larson asked the group to provide any civic groups/professional organizations that Mr. Page could present the LRTP to. For our federal certification, we have to show that we have been out in the community to present on this.

### H. REGIONAL ALTERNATIVE FUEL/INFRASTRUCTURE MASTER PLAN PRESENTATION

Ben Moore of RS&H gave a brief presentation on the Regional Alternative Fuel/Infrastructure Master Plan.

Mr. Moore asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

### I. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Clayton Levins gave the following update.

- Automotus Al analysis of commercial loading zones
   The City of St. Augustine will conduct a pilot of this technology along King Street, as well as some other side streets.
- Cyvl Lidar analysis for asset conditions
   A pilot of this technology will take place in the City of Neptune Beach.
- GeoMate Satellite images for roadway inventory
- Doug Conkey asked if all three of these technologies could be used for a regional project.
  - Mr. Sheffield responded we would have to see what that might look like.
- Chairman Companion commented having the data and it be correct and up to date is important.
- Taylor Abernathy commented every three years we update our data for pavement management. This would be a great tool.

### J. OLD BUSINESS

• Federal Certification Update – Jeff Sheffield informed the group FHWA has indicated the four areas that they will focus on for the certification. We are awaiting questions and will provide the answers. The certification will take place May 2. We may call upon a few of you to share your experience with working with the TPO.

### K. NEW BUSINESS

- HB 7049 and SB 1032
  - Creates moratorium on new MPOs adjacent to existing ones
  - Repeals the MPOAC

- Requires FDOT to, at least annually, convene MPOs of similar size to exchange best practices
- Requires FDOT to create performance metrics to evaluate each MPO annually
- MPOs that fall under a certain metric will be placed under the control of the Florida Secretary of Transportation for one year
- o Highest performing MPO each year receives \$5 million
- o Sets requirements for what must be included in a LRTP
- This proposed legislation is not consistent with the federal legislation that creates MPOs
- Doug Conkey wanted to know if this bill passes, would it impact the LRTP process.
  - Mr. Sheffield responded that it would not impact the LRTP process.
- Jeff Sheffield informed the group the TPO has secured federal funding that will allow us to evaluate additional technologies in the storm sensor space. At some point, I will need one representative from each of the four counties to participate on a steering committee to help evaluate these technologies.


